



Johanniter in Mozambique

Our Goal

Johanniter's health programming centers on improving access to crisis-resistant, barrier-free health, nutrition as well as water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) services. This holistic approach strengthens local capacities and government structures, with a focus on vulnerable communities, especially women and children.

Consortia Lead

Mozambique is one of the poorest countries in the world, with around 70 percent of the population living below the poverty line. The country is also one of the African countries most affected by climate change. On top of that, the ongoing insecurity in **Cabo Delgado** and nearby provinces has displaced people and disrupted food systems, with about 580,000 internally displaced people and 610,000 returnees facing difficult conditions.

Together with **ADPP Moçambique, Ayuda en Acción Moçambique and Acted**, Johanniter started a consortia project, that aims to provide life-saving assistance to 52,400 conflict-affected and displaced people in Cabo Delgado. By restoring access to primary health services and providing integrated protection, water, sanitation and hygiene, education in emergencies and multipurpose cash transfers we meet urgent needs and recurrent shocks. The project is co-funded by European Union. Johanniter has taken on the role of consortium lead.

Active since eight Years

In Mozambique, Johanniter has been active since 2019, starting with the deployment of its WHO-registered Emergency Medical Team after Cyclone Idai in Beira. Since then, Johanniter has been implementing programmes in health, WASH, nutrition, food security, livelihoods, peacebuilding, and disaster risk management. Johanniter main office is in Pemba, Cabo Delgado Province with fully established structure and a pool of 35 employees including 4 international staff and more than 100 volunteers.

Our programmes are supported by the German Federal Foreign Office (GFFO), the German Federal Ministry of Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ), Astellas Global Health Foundation (AGHF) and EU Humanitarian Fund (ECHO) as well as private funds. We maintain transparency and accountability through rigorous financial management practices, and we conduct annual audits.



In our mobile clinics we treat the patients from rural areas.
